Annual Report of the Vice Chancellor July 2017

William Carey University has completed another year of existence! There have been memorable moments and there have been times of concern and uncertainties. God has helped us to stay firm, have hope and work with the best of our abilities. I would like to highlight some of our achievements and shortcomings.

1. Programs:

A. Residential Training Camp on Youth Leadership and Community Development was organised by William Carey University (WCU), Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS) and Nongmensong Youth Development Organisation (NYDO) at the William Carey University, Nongmynsong, Umkdait, Shillong. The program was held from the 7 to 11 March 2017. The five days programme was realised as a result of the joint efforts of WCU faculty, staff, students and the members of NYDO under the wise and experienced guidance of Dr S.D Singh, District Youth Coordinator, NYKS, Shillong.



Dr. P G Jangamlung Richard, Asst. Professor, WCU was the program Coordinator of TYCLD. In order to facilitate the smooth functioning of the programme the faculty and staff of WCU and the members of NYDO were divided into different committees, comprising of an Advisory Committee, Program Committee, Accommodation Committee, Food Committee, Water and Sanitation Committee, Finance Committee, Disciplinary Committee and Cultural Committee. The campers were divided into six groups named after beautiful flowers, viz. Lily, Tulip, Rose, Jasmine, Dahlia and Gladiola. Each group consisted of about 15 boys and girls. The rooms were named after eight different rivers of North East India, viz. Brahmaputra, Barak, Um-iam, Siang and Tuichang for girls and Teesta, Loktak and Doyang for boys. 12 to 15 campers were allotted in each room.

There were a total of 75 campers in the TYLCD Camp, 4 from NYDO, 4 from NYKS, 67 from WCU. There were a total of 22 volunteers from WCU, 9 from NYDO, 1 from NYKS. There were a total of 12 people who were registered as organisers which included the Vice Chancellor and Registrar of WCU, 4 faculty members of WCU, Dr. Salam. D Singh, of NYKS and 5 members from NYDO. Thus a total of 119 people took part in the TYLCD camp, 2017.



The camp routine consisted of a wake- up call at 6am, physical exercise led by Constable Khupminthang Misao, 11 Battallion from the Border Security Force Mawpat at 7am, Breakfast at 8am, Campus cleaning at 9am and one or two (out-door) community development programmes or (indoor) talks and presentations on important social issues related to the youths from 10 am to 5pm, from 6pm to 8pm they took part in cultural activities after which dinner was served. The day came to an end at 10pm.



Talk on Skill Development

Smt. Audrey Khonglam, Skill Development Officer, Meghalaya Skill Development Society, spoke on the Scope of Skill Development. Ms Audrey explained the youth were full of freshness, energy, strong in spirit. She said that about ¼ of the population of Meghalaya were youth and youth were the backbone of our country and they were the future builders of the country. She urged the campers to (a) Look for opportunities (b) Make things happen (c) Put skills into practise (d) Persevere (e) Take pride in their work and have dignity for labour. She also listed a few steps to have a successful life: (a) hard work (b) discipline (c) positive approach/attitude (d) self belief (e) focus.

Cultural Program

The cultural programmes were held each night under the guidance of the cultural committee led by Mrs. Balensha Nongrum, Asst. Professor WCU.



International Women's Day Rally

The International Women's Day was celebrated by the TYLCD on 8 March. The campers along with 60 school students from 4 different schools located in and around Nongmensong area namely, St. George Secondary School, Holy Cross Secondary School, Bhanu Bhakta Secondary School and Padma Memorial Secondary School took part in a rally protesting crimes against women.





Cleaning Drive

After the rally, the campers took part in cleaning the market area of Nongmensong, the shop keepers also took part in the cleaning drive. Garbage trucks were also arranged to collect the garbage. Due to the hard-work of the campers and the shopkeepers the cleaning drive was a success.

National Integration and Multiculturalism

In the afternoon, talks and presentation were made on two related issues, National Integration by Dr. Paul Mohan Raj, Vice Chancellor, WCU and Multiculturalism and Multicultural education by Mrs. Sumita Marthong Asst. Professor Department of English WCU.

Swachh Bharat Mission

At 9:30 am all the campers and volunteers boarded the bus to go to Mawlong village for the day's activities. The program was divided into two sections; the first section was an

awareness program for the villagers held in the Village Dorbar Hall (meeting house), the chief facilitator for this program was Mr. C.C Wanniang, Asst. Engineer, In charge of **Swachh Bharat Mission**, Mylliem C&RD Block. The second section comprised of two activities for the campers of TYLCD (students of WCU, members of NYDO and students selected by NYKS), planting of trees and spreading awareness about Swachh Bharat to the school students of the village.



The village headman had announced and informed the villagers about the awareness program to be held at 10 am on 9 March in the premise of the village Dorbar Hall. The village headman, secretary and other members of the village helped the campers in setting up the seating arrangements for the program.

Tree Planting



In the afternoon, the campers along with the volunteers and organisers were divided into two groups and moved in two different directions. The first group, consisting of four different houses of the campers along with some faculty of WCU and some volunteers from NYDO, walked to one of the schools in the village, in order to plant some trees in its compound and also to spread awareness about Swachh Bharat. The second group which comprised of two houses of the campers, some WCU faculty, NYDO volunteers and the village Headman and Secretary, walked on to the football and planted several saplings.



Voter Awareness Program

A Voter Awareness Program was also a part of the TYLCD camp. The resource person for the program was Dr. Mrs T S R Marak, Asst. Commissioner, In-charge of Elections, East

Khasi Hills District, Meghalaya.

C. The Third International Day of Yoga:

6. Term of Office of the Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor:

The Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor were reappointed for another term.

7. Financial Matters:

A summary of the financial statement for 12 months is attached. We are grateful to our sponsors for continuing to send us rupees five lakh per month for the operational expenses of WCU.

Attached are the five budgets which include the annual budget for 2017-18 as it exists today. Second is the budget which should have been implemented this year, but was held back due to lack of funds. The third is the budget for 2018-19 which needs to be approved if we want the development of the university. The fourth budget caries on with the same intention of development in mind. The fifth budget for 2020-2021 shows changes that indicate how we can break even. From 2022, we will see WCU as a full-fledged and developed institution with UGC recognition and with active support of the Government and UGC. The sponsors need not provide any more money for the operational expenses of the university. The capital investment of close to 8 crore that we are suggesting in the third budget is what I feel should have been done a few years ago and if we do not do it now, it will be too late for the development of the university.

8. Future Plan and Programs:

- A. A national seminar on the theme Prudent and Responsible Use of Renewable and Non Renewable Resources of Meghalaya is being organized from 7-9 September here in the University. We expect 150 delegates to participate.
- B. The undergraduate programs will begin from July 2018.
- C. More faculty members will be recruited soon. Every department will have one Professor, two Associate Professors and two Assistant Professors.
- D. Ms Baiphira Lyngskor will supervise the undergraduate programs at Umsning.
- E. A campus site in Shillong has to be identified, bought and construction of buildings should begin with expert assistance. By 2020 we need to get ready the admin building, classrooms and library, hostels for boys and girls, VC's residence, some faculty residences.
- F. Engage in increased promotion and publicity to increase student enrolment.
- G. Introduce popular diploma and certificate courses.
- H. Increase the library strength by 20 thousand volumes in two years.
- I. Work towards zero dependence on sponsors after 2021.
